## STAG CRUISE 2015 - FUN IN LONG BEACH HARBOR



The Stag Cruise event came back with a vengeance this year, with four boats and eight attendees at the anchorage near Oil Island White in Long Beach Harbor. There was the ***Meant To Be*** with Doug Dworski and guest Jim Kirby, the ***Rogue*** with Tom Mayes and Harry Hutton, the ***Sea Shanty*** with Charlie Batton and Larry Codner, and the ***Slainte***, with guests Alan Cunningham and Ross. We all gathered on Friday afternoon, July 17, for Happy Hour and a cookout and potluck dinner aboard the ***Meant To Be***, and plenty of good food and drink. We had purposely anchored up close to the waterfall, and were

treated to a great scenic background for our party, complete with spectacular water and lighting. Festivities continued until late in the evening, when all of the partiers returned to their respective boats for a good night's sleep.

Saturday, July 18, dawned nice and sunny, and we proceeded to have breakfast on board our respective boats. About 9:15 a.m., we were treated to the roaring start of the Long Beach to Catalina Water Ski Race, with a large number of very fast (and very noisy) power boats all taking off with skiers in tow, heading for Avalon. The winner of this race typically finishes the course to Avalon and back in less than an hour. No sooner did we finish breakfast, than it was time to start making our way to the Belmont Pier dinghy dock, and then to the Belmont Brewing Company for lunch. While heading into the pier, we were treated to Dragon Boat races taking place just offshore of the peninsula section of Belmont Shore. We were joined at the Brewing Co. by Darrell Sausser, Allen Miles, and Rod and Kathryn Coomber, making us a party of twelve. The food and drink were great, as always, and we had a nice view of Long Beach Harbor, Island White, and our anchorage while having lunch. We were also treated to a rather heavy rainstorm, accompanied by thunder and lightning while eating outside on the patio. We timed it just right, and the rain let up long enough for us to return to our boats and make preparations for the Saturday afternoon party. The harbor was a bit choppy by now, and we took on quite a bit of water over the bow of the dinghy, so that everyone had a wet behind by the time we got back.



After a short break, we began preparing appetizers and the “drink of the cruise,” thoughtfully supplied by Harry Hutton. We actually had two drinks, and without giving you the full name (as this is a family publication), let us just say that they were abbreviated AMF #1 and AMF #2. The first contained vodka, gin, rum, blue curacao, sweet and sour mix, and 7-Up. The second was just a mixture of equal parts of tequila and Kahlua. It took a while to get

the party started because of rain and stormy weather, but it finally let up enough to allow the other participants to make their way to the **Meant To Be**. Several batches of each drink were consumed, and then we switched back to beer and wine to wash away the excessive sweetness of the cocktails.
