

2016 MEMORIAL DAY CRUISE Wrap-Up May 27 – 30, 2016

We had another successful cruise this year, thanks to the hard work of Port Captains Doug & Susana Dworski, Larry & Hedy Codner, Darrell Sausser and his crewmate Debbie Neal. We also had help from Navy Yacht Club Fleet Captain Becky Martinez. In addition to the participation of the MYCLB membership and guests, we had boats from Alamitos Power Squadron, Navy Yacht Club of Long Beach and Long Beach Singles Yacht Club. This cruise has become one of the best attended events on the annual schedule! This year we had 34 people attend one or more of the activities during the long weekend, and had nine boats in the raft up on Saturday. The Port Captains once again tried to outdo themselves to provide a memorable and fun experience for the participants, and we succeeded once again.

Due to busy schedules, we didn't head down to Newport Harbor until Friday, May 27, on the *Meant To Be*, and luckily found the Lido anchorage to be relatively uncrowded, allowing us to pick an ideal spot for the group. We were then joined by Jim and Joan Wolfelt on the *Sea Siren*, Larry and Hedy Codner on the *Sea Scape*, Jim and Mary Lium on the *Chesapeake*, Tony and Becky Rietdyk on the *XSail*, John and Tina Caldwell on *Summer Wind*, and my guest Dan Dawes of the Alamitos Power Squadron on the *Helen Pauline*. It wasn't too long after we got all of these boats tied together and anchors set, that it was time to head over to Woody's Wharf for dinner. We were joined there by Harry Hutton and Tracy Cleveland, Alan and Katy Cunningham, Tom Mayes and Mary Barton, Jo Murray, Darrell Sausser and Debbie Neal, and a number of guests from Navy Yacht Club. After returning from dinner, we were joined by Darrell and Debbie aboard the *Meant To Be*, as their boat was having its engine replaced and wasn't ready in time for the cruise. Parties aboard the boats continued well into the night.

After a pleasant night at the anchorage, we began preparations for breakfast, only to suffer a generator failure on our boat. Fortunately, Susana got the breakfast prepared with the help of our neighboring boats (thanks to the Liums and Wolfelts for their assistance), and we had a breakfast burrito bar, fresh fruit, coffee, and of course mimosas, bloody marys, and tequila sunrises. After breakfast, the MYCLB Bridge had a short meeting, and then we awaited the arrival of two more boats.

Rod Coomber and his crewmate Phil Collins had planned to join us on Friday, but experienced a overheating problem and had to return to port. Fortunately, Rod was able to get the problem repaired, and he and Phil joined the raft aboard the *Lady Kathryn* on Saturday afternoon. No sooner did we get them tied up than we started the Saturday afternoon activity, which was a blindfolded dinghy race. On each dinghy, the rower is blindfolded and the other member of the team gives him/or her directions. The start and finish line was the stern of the Meant To Be and we had six teams participating: John Caldwell and his son, the Codners, Wolfelts, Dworskis, Coomber/Collins, and Neal/Martinez. Needless to say, we provided a great amount of entertainment for the raft up, as well as many of the other boats in the anchorage (who we occasionally ran into). The competition was fierce, but John Caldwell and son took first place, only seconds ahead of the Wolfelts and Dworskis.

Shortly after the dinghy race concluded, the ninth boat joined the raft up. The **Norske Dame** captained by Rhonda Rowley, Commodore of the Long Beach Singles Yacht Club and her three person crew arrived just in time for dinner. We barbecued a marinated chicken, and all of the participants in the raft up supplied side dishes for a tasty dinner consumed aboard a

number of the boats. After dinner and dessert, the festivities continued and socializing aboard the boats was the order of the day.

Two of our boats, the Caldwells on *Summer Wind* and Dan Dawes on *Helen Pauline*, departed early on Sunday due to other commitments. The remainder of the group headed over to the Bluewater Grill for Sunday Brunch, where we were joined by Charlie Batton and Marilyn Austin, Corkey and Phyllis Maywhort, Tom Mayes and Mary Barton, Harry Hutton and Tracy, Allen and Dianna Miles and Kathleen Collins. The food was good, and we had a great time as always. We announced the winning team of the blindfolded dinghy race - John Caldwell and son, even though he wasn't there to claim his prize. After brunch, we went our separate ways to walk off the big meal and get more ice and supplies. Then it was back to raft up to prepare for the Sunday afternoon cocktail party.

The theme for the cocktail party this year was "Holidays" with each boat selecting a drink and appetizer that complemented the holiday that they had chosen. As in the past, we started at one end of the raft and worked our way to the other end. Drinks and food were served in progressive style, starting at the *Norske Dame* – Ground Hog Day, then moving to the *Lady Kathryn* – Cinco de Mayo, *Sea Siren* – Italian Liberation Day, *Meant To Be* – Oktoberfest (Dworskis) and Chinese New Year (Sausser/Neal), *Chesapeake* – Memorial Day, *XSail* – April Fools Day, and ending at the *Sea Scape* – with another Cinco de Mayo. There were an outstanding number of different drinks and appetizers served as we moved from boat to boat, and most of us made it from one end to the other without incident.

Monday morning dawned overcast, as some of the boats prepared to depart for their home ports. First *XSail*, then *Chesapeake*, and finally *Norske Dame* departed the raft up, leaving the last four boats in the raft who were all staying until Tuesday morning. It was just the *Sea Siren*, *Meant To Be*, *Lady Kathryn* and *Sea Scape* left in the anchorage. We all relaxed aboard our boats on Monday, taking in the sights of passing boats and kayaks. I took Darrell and Debbie back to their car, along with all of their remaining supplies. Later in the day we had a relaxing Happy Hour on the boats, and then the whole group went to the Sol Restaurant for dinner before calling it a day.

On Tuesday morning, we had a leisurely breakfast before dismantling the remainder of the raft up one boat at a time, and then picking up our bow anchor and departing the anchorage. We all then made our way back to our respective home ports. It was a great five days and a good time was had by all.

Avalon Cruise Wrap-Up June 10,11 & 12, 2016

Information for Visiting Yachtsmen

Printed Name

- 1. Slip Assignments are permanent and guests will NOT be allowed to move or relocate to another slip unless approved by the Marine Bureau. Violation of this policy will result in the towing and impounding of your vessel at great expense to you and your reciprocal privileges will be revoked.
- 2. Guests shall provide copies of valid identification, vessel documentation, registration and evidence of insurance with a minimum \$100,000 liability or \$300,000 CSL (combined single limit) prior to requesting reciprocal slip assignments.
- 3. SYC members slips the check in is at noon and check out time is at 10:00am. *X-101 only check out is noon*
- 4. Guests shall obey all of the Marina Rules and Regulations, and Marina Policies, including no swimming in the Marina.
- 5. Parking Permits will be issued by the Shoreline Yacht Club based on availability but is NOT guaranteed.
- 6. Electrical power (30 amp or 50 amp) should be available but is NOT guaranteed. You can only plug into your assigned slip's electrical pedestal. You are responsible for providing your own adapter/pigtail.
- 7. Key/Gate FOB's require a \$50.00 deposit that are issued by the Shoreline Yacht Club.
- 8. Gates and locks must not be taped or modified to circumvent or negate key usage. Individuals (guests included) responsible for doing so will be required to immediately remove their vessel and vacate the premises.
- 9. All entertaining must be done aboard the vessel or fingers ONLY. Blocking or restricting traffic on the docks is prohibited.
- 10. Barbeques, keg beer, ice or cup tables shall not be placed on the dock, fingers, or dock boxes. All such material must be contained aboard the vessel.
- 11. The Marine Bureau must authorize all vessels in the marinas.
- 12. California Boating Law requires that Current vessel registration or USCG documentation must be kept aboard the vessel at all times. Vessel operators must present to the Marine Bureau, Marine Patrol, Rescue Boat Operator, or other authorities, current certificates of registration or USCG documentation upon request. In addition, if an operator is not the vessel owner he or she may be requested to provide proof of the owner's permission to use such vessel.
- 13. All alcoholic beverages will NOT be carried past the dock gate into the Long Beach Shoreline Marina parking lots. Make sure your guests understand and comply with this restriction.
- 14. Loud music, that which can be heard two (2) slips away, must cease by 8 pm. A request to lower the music volume by any nearby boater, Marine Bureau employee, Marine Patrol Officer or Long Beach Police Department Officer must be complied with IMMEDIATELY.
